Parenting is a difficult and often confusing task. We are always searching for the best ways to raise healthy and confident children. Research shows that by following these positive guidelines, you can help your children succeed at school while developing trust in the parental relationship. Below you will find eight Power of Parenting guidelines:

- 1) Give children warmth, acceptance and respect. You, the parent, need to express these feelings on a daily basis.
- 2) Use fair and firm leadership. Children do not naturally know right from wrong. You, the parent, must teach by example.
- 3) Avoid verbal abuse. Parents who insult their children are harming them emotionally.
- 4) Create a home life that supports education. Be prepared to help with homework assignments.
- 5) Be an active partner with your child's school. Support the teacher's rules and don't criticize the school or teacher in front of your child.
- 6) Teach children about their own and other cultures. Your children need to know how to get along with many different types of people in order to succeed.
- 7) Limit television viewing time and monitor quality of programs.
- 8) Maintain a healthy life style and set a good example of life-long learning.

Putting these guidelines into practice is the best gift you can ever give to your children.
